## Topic: 1000-hr Gear Inspection Go/No-Go Gauge Set and Its Use

How to prepare for and use the Go/No-Go gauges from a round table of experienced owners and A&Ps who have used the kit and know the Comanche gear system. These A&Ps and owners/pilots have recently used the gauges in owner-assisted annuals. Join us for a casual round table on preparation for and use of the go/no-go gages.

Tonight is to discuss a couple of things about measurement of the landing gear during the 1000 hour gear AD:



- 1. You can use the go/no-gages wrong
- it would be wrong to only measure one dimension with a pin gage (because you are looking for egg shaped wear) . It would be wrong to have any gage (pin or bore) in crooked.
- 2. Here's how to use them right.
- 3. Here's how to get ready to use them.
- 4. Discuss whether it may be cheaper and safer to skip the measurements and just replace all your bolts and bushings?
- 5. Why you may want to measure anyway (are there measurements that will indicate things that really should be looked at that are not covered by replacing everything)?
- 6. Other useful tools like bore gauges and vernier calipers and micrometers.

Above order may change, logically.
