2. how to properly tie down and secure and gust lock and WHY - did you know almost as many airframes are lost to ground situations as to air problems? Do you know all airplanes (except the vagabond) have drain holes to the REAR of the stabilator/elevator?

3. a cool tip on how to EASILY create your own COILED CORDS to keep your cockpit neat, safe, and professional looking.
