

## Message From The Tribe Chief

I think our Northeast presence at the Savannah Convention was very successful. We were able to spread the word about the Baltimore 2012 plans very effectively. I made a verbal report (via Skype) to the Old Board Meeting on Tuesday, put up a display (posters and computer show) for the Seminar day on Thursday, did a full blown presentation for the General Meeting on Friday morning, another verbal sales pitch at the Mighty 8th dinner following Airport Day, and yet another verbal pitch at the final Awards Dinner on Saturday. I think it is safe to say that everyone knows what we have planned and who I am. Keith Johnson and I both wore our Baltimore billboard shirts for Airport Day, and I flashed the assembled throngs at the Awards Dinner. All in all, it was a very successful campaign. Everyone had positive reactions to both the choice of Baltimore and to the proposed schedule.

Speaking of the schedule, I think it has pretty much gelled as a result of the many discussions with former presenters. The latest 2012 schedule and seminar topics are presented later in this newsletter. The major changes are in the structure of the Seminar day (Friday) and moving the General Meeting to Friday evening.

For the Seminars I would like to see a table of munchies (pastries and beverages, other light foods) in the vendor area. Each seminar will be scheduled for 45 minutes (and be videotaped), with the room cleared between seminars. People will be urged toward the food where the vendors can do their sales pitches. This approach worked in Dayton, and the vendors were happy to be there.

Moving the General Meeting to Friday evening just seems like the best idea since sliced bread, but is a big change from tradition. It makes sense in the scheme of the Convention, and also encourages people who want to arrive late to come in for this meeting. We will need to plan a meal (not too extravagant) and find a room for about 120 diners. We will also need a head table for perhaps 8-10 Board members (I'm thinking of making the meeting available via Skype).

One thing that I learned for Savannah is that at least 2/3 of those attending were couples. This fact had not hit me earlier. We do need to offer help in social activities, both for small groups and for individual couples. We also need to assure the reduced hotel rate for the days before the Convention, and those following. We will put together a list/guide of area attractions for people to plan from. Also we will need a list of nearby restaurants for Tribe Dinner planning.

We need to "walk the walk." By this I mean, fly in to Martin State, check it out, get ourselves to the Holiday Inn, check in for the night, sample the food, visit the *Sprit of Baltimore*, and generally walk the neighborhood. This may reveal other areas of possible problems. Again, see the Convention update further down in this newsletter.

I am working on a pre-registration web for to send out to the ICS membership. We will use Dave Fitzgerald's new found email web ability to survey members as to who might be coming, and what planned activities they

are interested in doing. From the responses we can generate an email list to send out appropriate forms and descriptions for actual registration etc.

By the way, there is talk of the European Tribe conducting a mass fly-over in honor of their 20 years of membership. Could mean 10 or more Comanches crossing the Pond! Savannah had 29 aircraft at Airport Day. Could be a nice crowd at Baltimore's Martin State.

# June and September Fly-Ins cancelled due to weather

Once again the Weather God's conspired against us. This makes three fly-ins this year that we had to cancel due to weather.

Dwight Coombe had arranged a great day for us at Ellenville, flying in to a new destination in upstate New York and having lunch at a nearby Italian restaurant. The weekend forecast was for scattered showers on Saturday, with scattered thunderstorms for Sunday. However, the terminal forecasts for the area on Friday showed low ceilings (500 to 1500 feet AGL) for Saturday morning. The traffic pattern for Resnick Airport is at 1400 feet, and the RNAV approaches have MDA's above 1800 feet – no way to land legally, so we cancelled, and an email was sent to the membership by Keith Johnson.

On a good note, there were four fly-in invitation responses using the web page. The provided email addresses allowed us to discuss the weather problems and make the call as an informed group. Please, use the web response form for the next fly-in you plan to attend so that, if a similar situation comes up, we can inform you directly.

The September fly-in to Latrobe PA also found heavy rains forecast for the entire weekend. It was decided to call it off. We had sent invitations to the Ohio members of the North Central Tribe.

## Fly-In at Orange, MA in July - Pete Morse, host

A dozen people made it to the July fly-in at Orange Municipal Airport (KORE) in central Massachusetts near the Quabbin Reservoir. A couple of members commented that this being the only fly-in destination in New England gave them an extra reason to make the effort. One couple stopped on their way from Connecticut to Bar Harbor, Maine, complete with their cat. Another Comanche pilot drove to Orange because he was too far out of currency to fly, and hoped that attending the fly-in would spur him to get back in the air again. Let's hope he was right!



After some friendly conversation and Comanche tire kicking we moved into the shade of the FBO for some serious ICS talk. Most of those attending used the web sign-up form to RSVP and found it very convenient. At least one email was sent to the list of responders advising of the busy skydiving activity at Orange.









Discussion topics were the upcoming Convention in Savannah and the Board meetings, next year's Baltimore Convention, the upcoming Tribe elections (see below), and the latest on the proposed Piper tail horn AD. ## 2012 ICS Convention planning update

Our 2012 ICS Convention will be in Baltimore, MD. September 12-16, 2012. Baltimore will be in the midst of a yearlong celebration of the bi-centennial of the "Star Spangled Banner," written by Frances Scott Key while observing the shelling of Ft. McHenry in the war of 1812. The convention will center on the Baltimore Riverfront, with all activities compressed into four days to reduce attendee costs. Housing will be at the Holiday Inn, directly across the street from Camden Yard, with room cost in the \$140/night range plus tax. There is a charge for overnight parking, but those who fly in will not have to worry about that. We are also working on a proposal for on-call van transportation during the convention.



Below is a general outline of the activities, as discussed

at the fly-ins this past summer, and presented at the Savannah Convention. Specific speakers and topics for the Seminars still need to be decided.

We are planning an opening reception on Wednesday evening, with Thursday evening open for Tribe dinners. Friday evening may be a dinner followed by the Annual General Meeting. Saturday evening will be the awards banquet, aboard the ship *Spirit of Baltimore*, cruising Baltimore Harbor.

Seminars possibilities include discussions on legal matters, Comanche care and maintenance, specific topics related to Comanche inspection ADs, as well as presentations by various vendors. We are working on providing a Pilot Companion seminar for the "co-pilots" in the group in cooperation with the Baltimore FAAST Team. This is an excellent chance for the non-pilots to learn about all phases of flight. All discussions will be tailored to Comanche operations, and the workshop will also be open to area pilots.

Other activities could include trips to the National Science Museum, the National Aquarium, nearby Fort McHenry, Camden Yard, the Walters Art Museum, and, of course, shopping at the Riverfront Mall. Airport Day will be at Martin State Airport (KMTN) on Saturday. The airport has plenty of room for arriving Comanches, and we should be able to have tie-down fees waived if fuel is purchased.
